12. What major values would you like to see instilled in your children? How would you go about teaching these to your children? How would your former spouse respond to this item?

13. Theoretically, what would constitute an ideal parental relationship in a divorce situation? What role should the other parent play in your children's lives? In your case, what do you think would represent the *best interests* of the children?
